PURPOSE

To advise the Committee of the Freshwater Bay Museum's activities from June to August 2020.

BACKGROUND

An updated report is provided to the Committee for each quarter.

DISCUSSION

Museum Program & Events

1. *HIACC July - Claremont Signal Cabin* - Rail Heritage WA's Geoffrey Higham and former Claremont signalman Chris French gave a history of the Claremont Signal Cabin. Tours of the cabin were held after.
2. *School Incursions* – Incursions resumed post COVID restrictions with visits to multiple classes at Dalkeith Primary, Swanbourne Primary and Cottesloe Primary. Over 150 children took part in the activities.
3. *Postcards from the Past* – Year 5 students from Scotch College, St Thomas' Primary and Freshwater Bay Primary all took part in this historical project. Museum staff attended school assemblies to hand out prizes to the winners chosen by Claremont Mayor Jock Barker.
4. *Coral Thomas 100th Birthday* – Long time Claremont resident, Coral Thomas celebrated her 100th birthday on 26 August. Museum staff visited Mrs Thomas with Mayor Barker to present flowers and interview her about her life and the changes she has seen in Claremont over the past 100 years.

Consultation Work

1. *Claremont Tigers* - Museum Staff had a meeting with Philip Sutton, Collector of Memorabilia at the Claremont Football Club regarding preventative conservation work need on 5 large banners dating back to 1939.
2. *Friends of Lake Claremont* – Members of the FOLC have contacted the Museum for advice on preserving their archives. The Museum will assist by helping them with digitisation.

Collection Management

1. *Collections WA* – Just under 400 photographic records have been uploaded to the site.
2. *Oral History* – The transcript for Ted Weir's Oral history has been completed.

Exhibitions

Raymond Sharkey – A mini exhibition has been installed in the Council foyer to support the letter transcription project.

WA Museum – Museum staff continued work with Marani Creatorex to supply photographs for the new WA Museum displays.

Publicity & Promotion

Flourish – The Winter edition included 2 articles by Museum staff: *A new facility to preserve our history* about the Museum redevelopment and *A signal of dedication* about the Claremont Signal Cabin and its volunteer Chris French.

Post Newspaper - Article on Postcards from the Past project *Postcards frame Claremont's past*, August 22 2020, and *Virus stamps out mail*, August 1 2020, on the Museum's COVID archive collection.
