CIVIC DESIGN AWARDS CATEGORIES

- 1. *Additions to Heritage Places***
Additions that complement and enhance a heritage building.
- 2. *Conservation of Heritage Places***
Outstanding conservation practice leading to a place being conserved and enhanced.
- 3. *New Buildings***
New development making a positive contribution by respecting a heritage streetscape.
- 4. *Special Projects***
Heritage projects outside the above categories. Examples are sustainable building design, adaptive reuse, garden conservation, and interpretation.

PRIZES

The winner(s) of each category will receive a prize certificate acknowledging their contribution to Claremont's heritage, along with a bottle of wine.

One overall winner, selected from the winner of each category, will be awarded \$1,000 in recognition of the excellence of their project.

ENTRY CONDITIONS

1. The project must have been commenced and/or completed in the 36 months prior to the competition deadline.
2. All nominations must contain:
 - a. A brief statement (maximum 300 words) describing the project and how it relates to the relevant category's criteria.
 - b. Photographs depicting the completed project, relevant plans, and photographs showing the place before works commenced (if available).
3. All submissions, including a statement from the owner(s) agreeing to entry, must be received by the Town of Claremont by 17:00 **18 December 2023**. Entries can be emailed to toc@claremont.wa.gov.au or mailed to Civic Design Awards, PO Box 54, Claremont WA 6910. Receipt will be acknowledged.
4. If a site inspection by judges is required, entrants will be contacted to arrange a convenient time.
5. A person or organisation can submit more than one project or enter a single project in more than one category.
6. Projects previously entered in the Awards cannot be resubmitted unless significant new work has taken place in the previous 36 months.
7. Judges' decisions are final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
8. The Town of Claremont reserves the right not to present an award.
9. The entrant grants the Town of Claremont a limited license to publish plans and/or images solely for the purposes of promoting and running the Awards.
10. The entrant guarantees to the Town of Claremont that the above entry requirements have been met.
